

Urinary System- Patient Case Scenario Part 1 Graphic Organizer #1

He is a Type A personality and a work-a-holic, who puts in extra hours in the office so that he can one day become a partner. Because he works long hours, Jason often eats in the office or on the way home by ordering in or picking up food at the local fast food restaurant. Recently, Jason has been feeling a little run down. His fatigue has gotten to the points where it is now affecting his concentration and ability to perform his job.

You and a team of doctors must diagnose Jason based on the evidence that you will gather from a variety of sources (Patient Interview, Physical Exam, Lab Tests).

Organize the evidence you collect by using the checklist provided. Finally, you will fill in the graphic organizer with your initial diagnosis (CLAIM), your EVIDENCE, and the REASONS for each piece of evidence. You will need to discuss, argue, and/or persuade which pieces of evidence is related to your diagnosis and needs to be in the graphic organizer. You will need to research your reasons. Some reasons can be found in the handouts and some reasons you will have to Google. Make sure your reasons are logical and logically link your evidence to your claim.
